

Mrs. King 's Homework Policy

Homework is an integral part of the learning process. With that said, there is a recommended amount of homework that is advised by the State of California. First graders should be given about 10-15 minutes of homework a day. Second graders should be given about 20-30 minutes of homework a night. This is not including independent reading time. Therefore, all first and second graders should read, or be read to, for an additional 10-15 minutes a night.

Homework is assigned every day of the week except Friday. Students will use a Homework folder provided by Mrs. King and be expected to turn it in daily. Usually, there will be 2-3 pages of homework per night. Math and language arts worksheets are most commonly sent home.

The homework is to be completed by the student only. You can assist them, but do not "do" it for them. I like to look at authentic work to help me guide my teaching. There will be a few projects for the students to complete at home, but specific instructions will be sent along with the child to assist you in knowing what they are to do.

When I look at homework, I do not usually give it a grade. I usually correct things and stamp it with a stamp that says "Practice work, Ungraded." The student does receive credit for doing the homework however and should see to it that they try their best to complete it. Any questions regarding homework can be asked of me on Class Dojo or through text.

Some homework assignments may include completing a learning activity using the IPADS given to them at school. These IPADS must be returned daily and kept in working order. Any damaged IPAD resulting from negligence at home will require a replacement or the cost of for replacing it.
